# Need for Collaboration

- Reduced budgets at all levels
- Unenforceable interagency agreements
- Limited cross-agency communication & resource-sharing
- Differing eligibility & funding for services
- Failure to think beyond traditional service systems & partners
- Sustaining existing efforts

# Community Resource Mapping

A **system-building** method that links community resources with an agreed upon vision, organizational goals, strategies, and/or expected outcomes.

# Why Community Mapping?

- Identify capabilities & capacities of a community - use to build a system
- Reveal community resources/assets, and highlight their interconnections
- Build relationships among various community stakeholders at all levels
- Focus on community strengths, not deficits - build capacity for change and improvement

# Why Community Mapping?

- Develop a systemic & coordinated approach to improve service delivery
- Determine whether existing resources are aligned & used effectively
- Develop innovative interagency financing strategies
- Promote collaborative staff development programs
